Mountain View Fire Settlement Proposed Projects

- Up to Five 30,000 Gallon Steel Water Tanks
 - Requested by the Antelope Valley Fire Department, for placement on publicly owned land.
- Pilot Fuels Treatment Project
 - Part of the Walker River Riparian Project, which encompasses fuels reduction work on approximately 66 acres of County-owned land along the Walker River Corridor. The pilot project would cover a smaller area in the Mountain Gate Park, and provide leverage for a much larger grant to fund the entire Walker River Riparian Project.
- On-Demand Dumpster Service
 - To provide the public benefit of reducing the spread of fire within the community, dumpsters would be delivered to public/commercial locations or private homes by agreement for homeowners to dispose of green waste from defensible space work. The program would be designed by the County to avoid a gift of public funds to private homeowners.
- Mountain Gate Park Improvements
 - Sustainable trails.
 - Riparian restoration within Mountain Gate Park, including removal of invasive species and planting native vegetation.
 - Storm overflow and fish refuge. To include creation of a pond south of existing park improvements to provide flooding protection, a side channel refuge for fish, and a migrating bird stopover.
 - *County note: stream channel modification (e.g., side channel and pond) is subject to state approvals*
 - Leverage funding for a grant to connect Walker to the developed portion of Mountain Gate Park.
- Valley Loop Route
 - 1) Identify a loop route through the Valley on County roads or public/Conservancy/easement lands for use by touring bicyclists, pedestrians and equestrians. 2) Acquire right of way and design and engineer the pathway. 3) Construct the pathway. The project may consist of only phase 1 (route identification), or phases 2 and 3 may be included if desired.
- Community Defensible Space
 - To provide the public benefit of reducing the spread of fire within the community, a program to remove vegetation on private property in compliance with CalFire defensive space requirements would be crafted by the County consistent with avoiding a gift of public funds.
